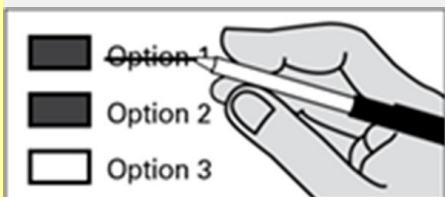
Use a dark blue or black ink pen to completely fill in the box to the left of your choice.

Proposition No. 1

Regular Property Tax Levy Lid Lift for Support of Parks and Recreation Services

The Board of Trustees of Eastmont Metropolitan Parks District adopted Resolution No. 2025-01 concerning an increase to its regular property tax levy. This proposition would provide stable funding for the continued operation of park services and recreational programs to the Eastmont Metropolitan Parks District. The proposition authorizes an increase to the District's regular property tax levy, currently \$0.15 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation, to \$0.22 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation, to be collected in 2025. This levy amount would be used to compute the limitations for subsequent levies as provided by chapter 84.55 RCW.

BONDS FOR HOSPITAL RENOVATION AND REMODEL

The Commission of Public Hospital District No. 1, Okanogan and Douglas Counties, Washington, adopted Resolution No. 2025-7 concerning a proposition for the construction of improvements to Three Rivers Hospital. If approved, this proposition would authorize the District to construct, equip and furnish improvements to Three Rivers Hospital and carry out other capital improvements deemed necessary or advisable by the Commission; issue no more than \$45,000,000 of general obligation bonds maturing within 30 years; and levy annual excess property taxes to repay the bonds, all as provided in Resolution No. 2025-7.

HOSPITAL DISTRICT ONE YEAR EXCESS LEVY

The Douglas County Hospital District No. 2 (Ambulance Services) Board of Commissioners adopted Resolution #88 on July 15, 2025, containing a proposition to finance maintenance and operation. BONDS TO REPLACE AND UPGRADE DETERIORATING SCHOOLS AND IMPROVE SAFETY

The Board of Directors of Lake Chelan School District No. 129 adopted Resolution No. 2025-03, concerning school improvements to provide safe facilities and enhance learning. This proposition would authorize the District to build: a new Morgen Owings Elementary School on property owned by the District; add ADA accessible health/fitness facilities and upgrade Career/Technical Education shops to industry standards at Lake Chelan Middle/High Schools; improve the Mountain Goat Field Complex for student/community use; issue \$73,000,000 of general obligation bonds maturing within 20 years; and levy annual excess property taxes to repay the bonds, all as provided in Resolution No. 2025-03.

LEVY FOR RETENTION OF BASIC PUBLIC SAFETY AND OTHER SERVICES

The Mansfield Town Council adopted Resolution No. 2025-06 concerning voter approval of its regular property tax levy on May 14th, 2025. In order to retain basic public safety, parks, community and other governmental services, this proposition would:

(1) Increase the regular property tax levy above the limit factor, to a rate of \$1.50 per \$1,000 assessed value for collection in 2027;

(2) Increase the 2028-2032 levy amounts by three percent (3%) ; and

(3) Authorize use of the 2032 levy amount as the base for computing levies in succeeding years, all as set forth in Resolution 2025-06.
