The legislature imposed, without a vote of the people, a retail sales tax on pass-through charges retail establishments collect for specified carryout bags, costing \$32,000,000 in its first ten years, for government spending.

Special Election Hospital District One Year Excess Levy

The Douglas County Hospital District No. 2 (Ambulance Services) Board of Commissioners adopted Resolution #81 on July 16, 2020, containing a proposition to finance maintenance and operation. This proposition would authorize the District to levy excess taxes upon all taxable property within the District in the sum of \$70,000, requiring collection of approximately \$0.36 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation in 2021.
